TO SEEK SUPPORT OF VANCOUVER ON FARM PRODUCE MARKETING ACT

A resolution favoring federal marketing legislation covering farm products was endorsed by Fraser Valley Boards of Trade meeting in Ladner, and it was decided to approach Vancouver Board of Trade with a view to securing support from that direction, it was reported at Monday night's meeting of the Chilliwack board. It was further reported that the Terminal City board had agreed to hear a delegation from the associated body on this subject.

IMPERIAL CO-OPERATION NECESSARY TO PEACE

Canadian delegates to the British Commonwealth Relations Conference in Toronto recently showed themselves as strongly opposed to any breach within the empire, Dr. Walter N. Sage, head of the department of history at the University of British Columbia, told Vancouver Kiwanians at their weekly luncheon Thursday.
