A large crowd attended the private performance of two one-act plays given by the Little Theatre Association Wednesday night in the Masonic hall. The two plays were both well carried out, the first, a comedy, being especially popular.

"Changing Places" portrayed the amusing possibilities of an exchange of duties between husband and wife.
